



FROM THE MAYOR

Dear Residents of Vernon,

Hope this letter finds you all surviving yet another wonderful C.N.Y winter. With spring just around the corner, the Village is getting ready to break ground on our new water extension. Our water line currently stops on Peterboro Street around the School Bell Apartments. We want to extend it down Peterboro to Indian Town and Youngs Rd. and connect to Rte. 5. Thus completing a loop in our system, which will increase water pressure in that area. This also keeps the water flowing and for lack of a better term, fresher. Our vision is development in the very near future to this area with more water available.

The Village has reached an agreement with the City of Sherrill to buy some of their allotment from Oneida. This agreement frees up 200,000 gallons a day that Sherrill is not using .But also leaves them with plenty to take care of what they use and still enough for future growth. This is just another example of small local governments working together for the betterment of the whole community. This is the only way our smaller communities can survive. Special thanks to Bob Commis who worked hard to help me pull this off.

The Village was able to recently secure a \$30,000 grant for a study on our Sewer Plant. The study is to see how we can make it more efficient, with the possibility of expanding. The new pole barn, built last fall, is part of the upgrade.

Your village board just finished the 2015-16 budgets with more good news. No increase in taxes, water or sewer rates. We have been fortunate enough to keep receiving VLT money which we in turn use to keep taxes down. Last year we accepted the agreement brought to us by Oneida County which also helped keep taxes flat. As long as these additional revenues keep coming in, we are able to keep all the services we provide and continue replacing sidewalks and repaying streets.

Ward Street is next in line for repaving. We are looking at sometime this summer to get that done. With that, we will have done every street in the village over the past few years. Something I am personally proud of.

We are always open for new ideas to better our village and encourage you to speak out to us with them. Our meetings are the 3rd Monday of each month at 730 at the Village Hall. We are also able to be reached by email or phone, numbers and email addresses can be found on our website, villageofvernonny.org

A LETTER FROM THE CODES OFFICE:

After a frigid winter we are all ready for spring! At the codes office we can help you prepare your house and outdoors for warmer weather. You can obtain a building permit for things like new decks, sheds and pools right at our office. You can also download the application for a permit on our website at www.townofvernon.com. Usually, you will be able to obtain you permit the same day.

Not sure if you need a permit for a project? No problem, Give our office a call at 829-2434 or stop in. We are open Monday thru Friday from 9am to 1pm. If those hours don't work for you just call us and leave a message and we will be glad to call you back with your answer.

Something else a lot of us look forward to in the spring and summer is being able to cook outdoors! Below are some tips to help keep you and you family safe during BBQ season.

- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat from the grills and in trays aubliud below the grill.
- Small cooking fires are allowed.
- · Fires cannot be left unattended and must be fully extinguished.
- · Only charcoal or clean, dry, untreated or unpainted wood can be burned.
- Propane and Charcoal BBQ grills should be strored

used at least 10 ft away from any structure.










- Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and pway from heat sources.

ASSESSORS' DEPARTMENT

Mary E. Dam, joined the Assessors' Department in December 2014 as our new Assessors' Clerk. Mary and husband Jon live in the Village of Vernon along with their 3 children. Mary has already learned that anything baked warms our heart. She comes

to us with several years of banking experience and working in the VVS school district. Welcome Mary to our interesting and exciting position.

Frequently Asked Questions - These are questions that come up often from across the Township and are mostly about Exemptions. You may find this information helpful along with our Town of Vernon Web Site (http://townofvernon.com/index.php).

You are always welcome to reach the Town Assessors' Office at 829-2587 with any question or need a more detailed follow-up answer.

- 1. What is Taxable Status Date mean? This is a crucial filing date; things that occur before of after this date may be different from the previous years Final Assessment Roll. The new Roll is used by all school districts and municipalities (except for Sherrill taxes) in the Town of Vernon. Ownership and physical condition of real property are assessed and all applications for exemptions must be filed with the assessor by this date (March 1).
- 2. Can the assessor lower my taxes? No, the assessor is only responsible for property assessment not property taxes. Property taxes are determined by each school district and municipality
- 3. Why did my taxes go up? Primarily taxes go up because;
 - tax rates from your school district or municipality have gone up, or
 - a special district has been added, or
 - you added improvements to your property, or
 - your income changed, or you
 - failed to re-new an exemption.

In some instances there is a combination of reasons.

- 4. How early can I renew or apply for a school STAR or Senior Citizen Exemption? You can bring into the Town Assessors' Office any and all renewal or new Exemptions starting in September.
- 5. Do I have to wait until I have my income taxes filed to apply for or renew my STAR or Senior Citizen Exemption? No, by mid-December you will receive a renewal application

form. Qualification will include income and expenses for the same period of the previous completed and filed tax return. If a tax return was not filed then proof of all income as if you were to file and all applicable medical expenses for the same year are needed.

- 6. What should I do if I misplaced the exemption renewal form that I received in December? You can come into Assessors' Office on or before Taxable Status Date (March 1) with required documentation, a new renewal form will be prepared.
- 7. What do I need to apply for a new or renew my Senior Citizen Exemption? You must provide proof of your previous year's income (social security and retirement benefits, interest, dividends, net capital gains, net rental income, net income from self-employment, salaries, and other earnings). Also proof of insurance premiums (health, dental, prescriptions, vision, hearing, and long term care), and insurance unreimbursed co-payments for medical and prescription expenses (include dental, eyeglasses, hearing aids and others as defined by the IRS), These medical expenses may be excluded from income.
- 8. How will I know if my Exemption application or renewal was approved? In April the Assessors' Office publishes in the Oneida Daily Dispatch a Legal Notice that the hard copy Tentative Assessment Roll is available for public review. All approved exemptions for all seven School Districts, Oneida County, Village of Oneida Castle, Village of Vernon, Sherrill, and Town Outside are listed. This Roll will also be available on Town of Vernon website (http://townofvernon.com/).
- 9. Why didn't I get the STAR Exemption on my County and Town Tax Bill? The STAR Exemptions only applies to School Taxes.
- **10.** Why do I have to come in every year and renew my exemption? Qualification for the Senior Citizen and STAR Exemption are dependent on annual income.
- 11. How do I know if I am eligible for an exemption? Contact the Assessors' Office on or before Taxable Status (March 1), you will be guided to what you may qualify for and how to apply.
- **12.** How do I have my mailing address changed? Furnish the Assessors' Office a written, dated and signed document (i.e. a marked up tax bill or a letter) with your new mailing address.
- 13. If I move within the Town of Vernon do my exemptions move with me? No, you would have to apply for the new location.
- 14. When I turn 65 do I automatically get the STAR Enhanced Exemption? No, along with age there are ownership, income, and residence requirements.
- 15. I bought my house in August and the school tax bill arrived in September with a STAR Enhanced Exemption.
 Will I keep the STAR Enhanced exemption if I am not

- 65 years old? No, the exemption is in place because the previous owner qualified. You must apply for any future exemptions on or before the next Taxable Status Date (March
- 16. What do I need if I am going to grieve my assessment? You may begin informally by reviewing your concerns with the assessor. If an agreement is not reached, you my file a complaint to the Board of Assessment Review (BAR) on Grievance Day (4th Tuesday in May).
- 17. What income tax year do I need to renew my STAR Enhanced exemption? Real property tax law requires a copy of preceding years NYS or Federal filed tax return. For example if you are renewing before taxable status date of March 1, 2016, your preceding years NYS or Federal filed tax return is 2014.
- 18. For the Senior Citizen exemption does my medical expenses and income year have to be the same? Yes, the expense and income year have to be the same year.
- 19. If I don't have to file income taxes why do I have to disclose my income to qualify for exemptions? Two commonly used exemptions (STAR and Senior Citizen) are income based and require disclosure of your income to be approved.
- 20. I have "life use" for the property where I live and I want my tax bills sent to my daughter? As "life use" owner just furnish to assessors' office a signed and dated letter including name and address to whom the bills are to be sent.

21. If I moved into the Town of Vernon from another town and stay in the same school district, does my STAR Exemption move with me? No, you would have to apply for the new home.

Bicentennial, chairman Chris Bishop, has some exciting surprises planned. Last year's festivities included a hot air balloon walk and the Utica Zoo mobile.



It's time to pull be back together. The library has housed items for many years. However, the library is expanding its own services and would like that area for its own use. Fortunately an area has been provided to house the items until a permanent solution has been found.


Meanwhile paper items are being digitalized. Articles from scrapbooks are indexed for use, photos and slides have been scanned along with other Town notes. To date I have file in categories such as

Buildings - with 9 folders of assorted photos and articles, Businesses - with 22 folders of assorted photos and articles, Churches - with 7 folders of assorted photos and articles, Clubs & Organizations - with 4 folders of assorted photos and articles, Fairs, Family Names folder - with 14 folders of assorted photos and articles, Library, Maps, Military, Obituaries, Portraits, Schools, Scrapbooks (indexing the articles which pertain to Town of Vernon), Slaves, Telephone service, Tragedies / Events, Vernon Center - with 12 folders of assorted photos and articles, Vernon Downs - articles as well as photos of horses, Weather Related articles

Inquiries have included the history of Dibble's Inn -the construction of the actual building, military service records for the Nathan and Aaron Davis family, Black/African American named John, Mary and York Hunter, a record book from V & V School, interior pictures of old

ladies home in Vernon Center especially the fireplaces, the Alling family from Vernon Center in the 1800's.
